





Overall theme for Spring Term: The Sermon on the Mount

Summary: The Sermon on the Mount is a collection of sayings and teachings of Jesus, which emphasizes his moral teaching and is found in the Gospel of Matthew (chapters 5, 6, and 7). It takes place relatively early in the Ministry of Jesus after he has been baptized by John the Baptist, had fasted and contemplated in the desert, and began to preach in Galilee.

The Sermon is the longest continuous discourse of Jesus found in the New Testament and has been one of the most widely quoted elements of the Canonical Gospels. It includes some of the best-known teachings, such as the Beatitudes, and the Lord's Prayer.

	Jesus is making clear that those motivated by hatred are no better than
	murderers. (The queen of hearts is a good example of such a person.)
	Living mindfully (looking to Jesus) is about nurturing those parts of us that
	respond positively and finding healthy ways to stop destructive anger.
	Finding joy in the moment.
Mon 14 th Feb 2022	Matthew 5: 38 – 48 Overcoming evil with Good
	Jesus suggests a range of radical alternatives to the 'eye for an eye' model.
